

**Plan any literacy activity with description & material required for each age group mentioned below along with their learning objective.**

**1. 0-2 Years**

**Literacy Activity:** Nursery Rhyme Sing-Along

**Description:** The [CoComelon](#) version of the 'Pat a Cake' nursery rhyme will play on the screen and the educator will lip-sync it while imitating the actions from the video.

**Material:** A laptop and projector

**Learning Objective:** Repeatedly singing the nursery rhyme will help the children pick up the language, and develop their speech and auditory skills. Moreover, it will aid in building and strengthening their brain connections.

**2. 2-3 Years**

**Literacy Activity:** Colouring the Letters

**Description:** The educator will trace each letter in the lower case on different A4 sheets with a marker and will ask the children to colour inside the letters. Even if the children aren't able to colour within the lines, it is absolutely okay.

**Material:** A4 size sheets, scissors, marker and crayons

**Learning Objective:** This activity will contribute towards letter recognition and help develop their fine motor skills.

**3. 3-4 Years**

**Literacy Activity:** Kick the Letter Cup

**Description:** The educator will trace each letter on different paper cups and line them in a row. He/she will ask the children to kick any one of the cups using a small ball and tell the class which letter is on their cup, turn-by-turn.

**Material:** Cups, two small balls and markers

**Learning Objective:** This activity will aid with their ability to recognise letters and also improve their memory.

**4. 4-5 Years**

**Literacy Activity:** Picture Storytime

**Description:** The educator will read the story '[I Wonder](#)' by [Daniel Errico](#) aloud. Pictures of the various characters (and the sounds that some of them make) will be

displayed (and played) on the screen as and when they appear in the story.

**Material:** Laptop and projector

**Learning Objective:** This activity will expose them to new words and sounds associated with some of these words. Moreover, it will help them remember certain words like rooster or river or earth by seeing images associated with the respective words.

## 5. 5-6 Years

**Activity:** Odd One Out

**Description:** The educator will provide worksheets to the children that will have three, three letter words. Two out of the three words will rhyme with each other and the third word will not. The children will be asked to identify the odd one in each group.

**Material:** A4 size worksheets

**Learning Objective:** This activity will help children identify words and help in the development of their cognitive skills.
